Beverly Roberts is the Director of the Mainstreaming Medical Program for The Arc of New Jersey. In this session, Beverly will discuss the federal definition of a developmental disability, the meaning of acronyms such as IDD/DDD as well as what it means to be dual eligible. She will discuss the health disparities related to lower cancer screening rates among those with intellectual and/or developmental disabilities.
