Notes:

The first community health centers in the US opened in the 1950's and '60's in Boston and the Delta Health Center during the time of the civil rights movement.

Originally, they were called neighborhood health centers, funded by President Lyndon Johnson's 'War on Poverty'. These centers are federally funded and designed to remove traditional barriers to care

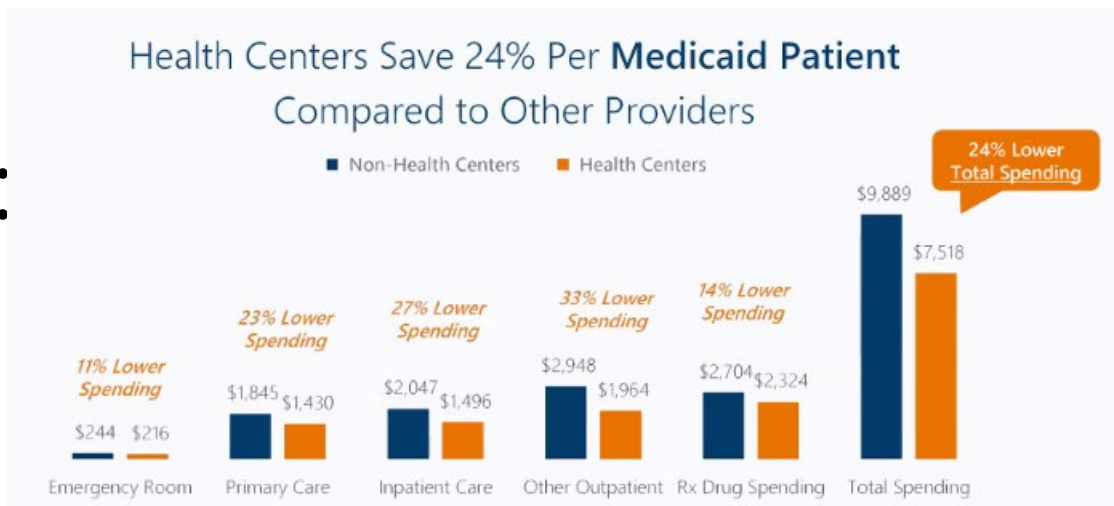
- lack of transportation
- language, literacy, and race
- providing services in communities where people would otherwise not have access to doctors, primary care, and other essential services

Many FQHC's go beyond the four walls of healthcare and provide:

- Employment Opportunities
- Childcare
- Assessing dangerous environmental conditions
- Social and medical services to people experiencing Homelessness
- Food insecurity and nutrition interventions

Benefits of FQHCs:

- Bipartisan support
- Serve over 30 million Americans (1 in 12 people, 1 in 9 children, 1 in 7 Racial/Ethnic Minorities, 1 in 5 Medicaid Beneficiaries, 1 in 5 uninsured persons, 1 in 3 people in poverty)
- Some serve specific populations (2 in NJ serve homeless populations exclusively, although ALL FQHCs serve homeless populations)
- On average, FQHC's save \$2,300 per Medicaid patient compared to other providers
- Generates \$54.6 billion in total economic activity
- Save the care system \$24 billion
- In 2021 FQHCs provided over 2 million in person and virtual visits, serving 569,142 patients.
- 94% of our FQHC patients are low income
- Close to 75% of FQHC patients are members of racial/ethnic minority groups

 - Morris, Sussex, and Warren Counties: Women who are pregnant and suffering from any sort of substance use issue (case management, support, counseling)
 - Intensive Senior Support Services
 - Provides intensive case-management in Morris County

- NJSNAP-ED (Rutgers)
 - Provides education on eating healthy on a budget
- Wise Woman Program
 - Part of American Heart Association, women over the age of 40 either not engaged in care or have a history of HPB, low income, or un-underinsured .
- Grow Garden State
 - Provides seeds to NJ Communities and Families

Zufall utilizes the Chronic Care Model (CCM) population-based and evidence-based practice. Model for Improvement is the PDSA (Plan, Do, Study, Act, (repeat)) Model.

Michelle Blanchfield: Would love to connect with other partners on how they screen for SDoH / HE

Mary Ann Donohue-Ryan: This is a question probably best asked of our social workers, so I can look into that for you and get you our screening to you, it is part of our electronic health records

Michelle Blanchfield: for us, closing the loop, finding out if they actually accessed the services

Beliza Mejia: Manager of Social Services at AHS Care Coordinator team, we want to connect those being discharged with services and prevent readmission. We do this through a 5-question screening on SDoH. If they respond positively, they are referred to our social services team which connects them to resources.
