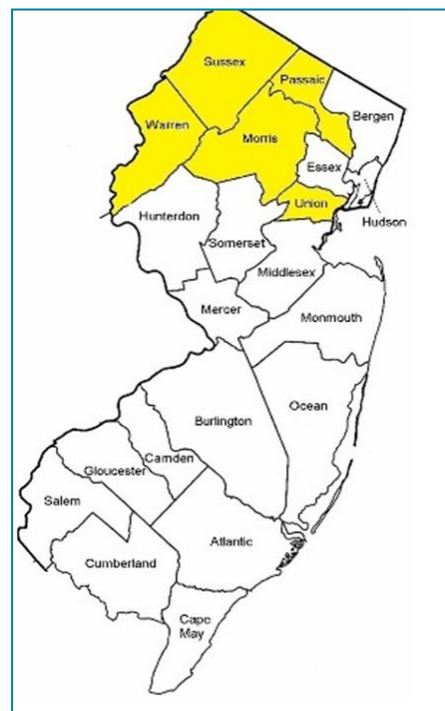
This report demonstrates our collaborations, our impact, and our continued commitment to Community Health, while our public health and healthcare partners were on the front lines serving the public during the pandemic.

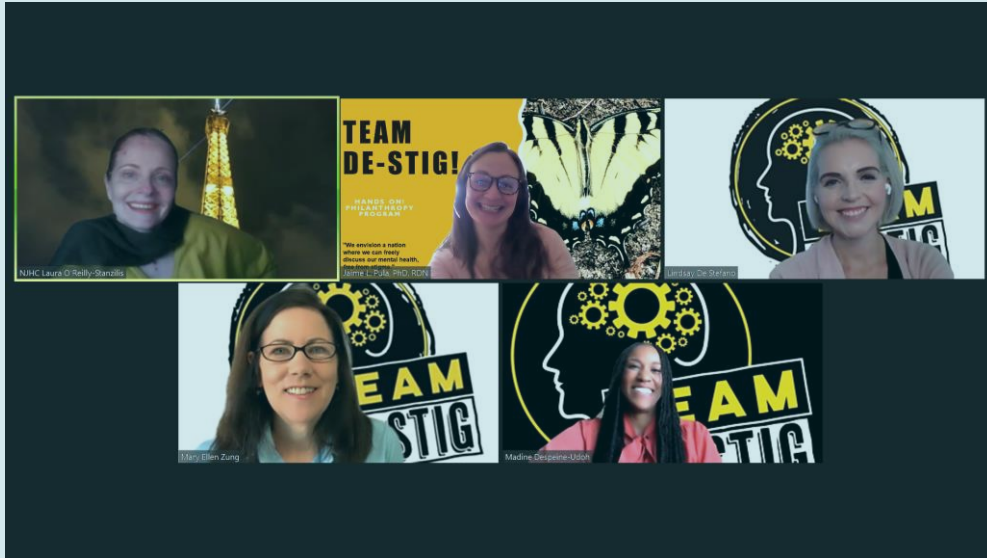

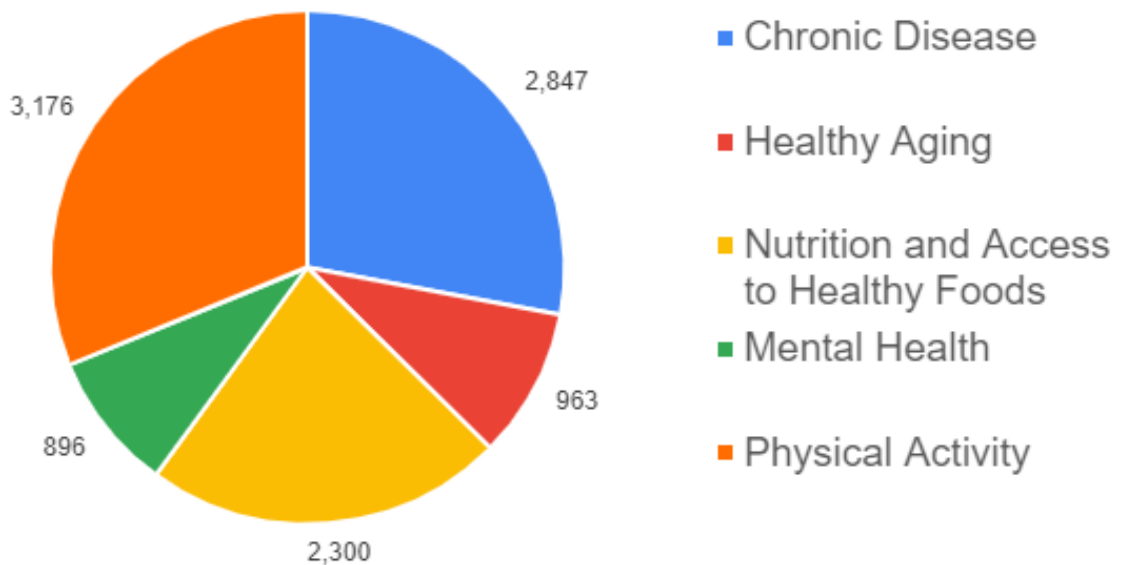

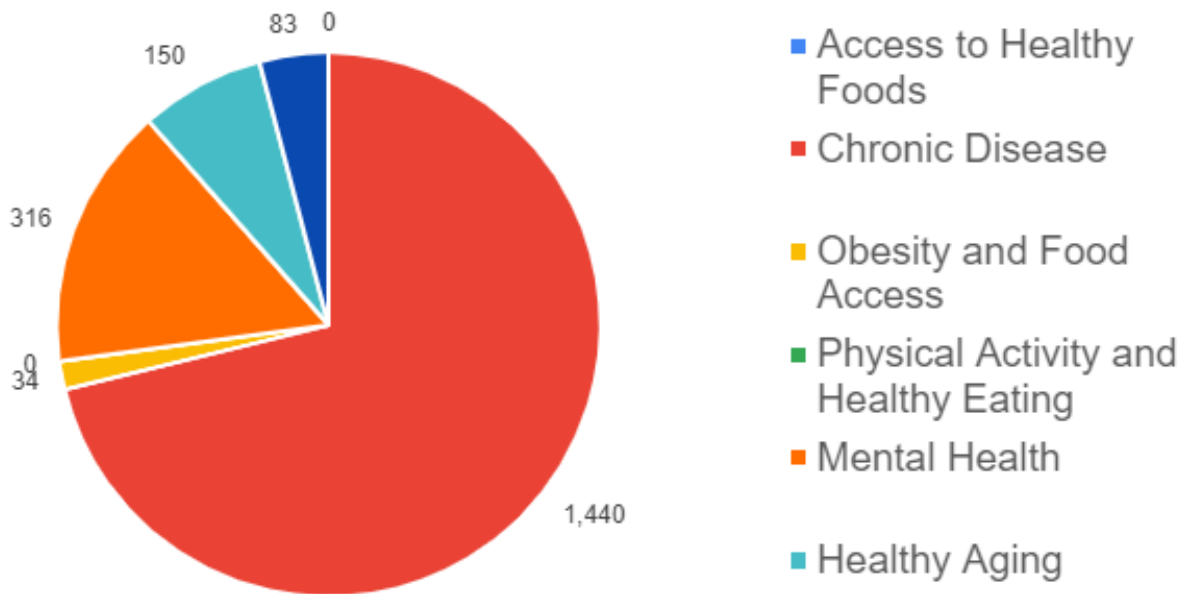

Passaic County 2,023

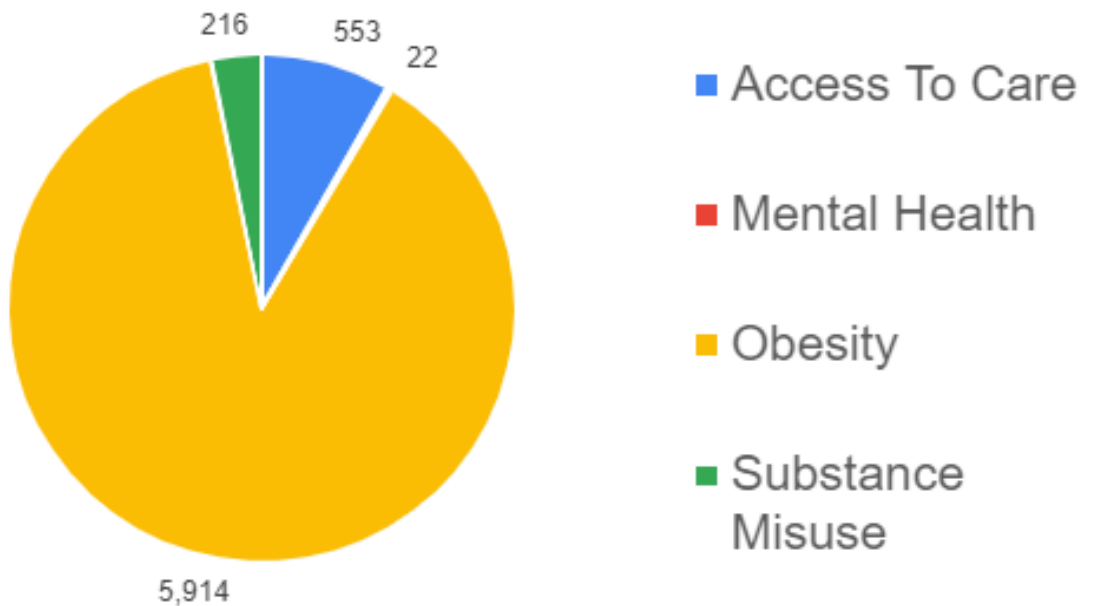
Collective Outcomes in Passaic County by CHIP Topic (# of individuals served)

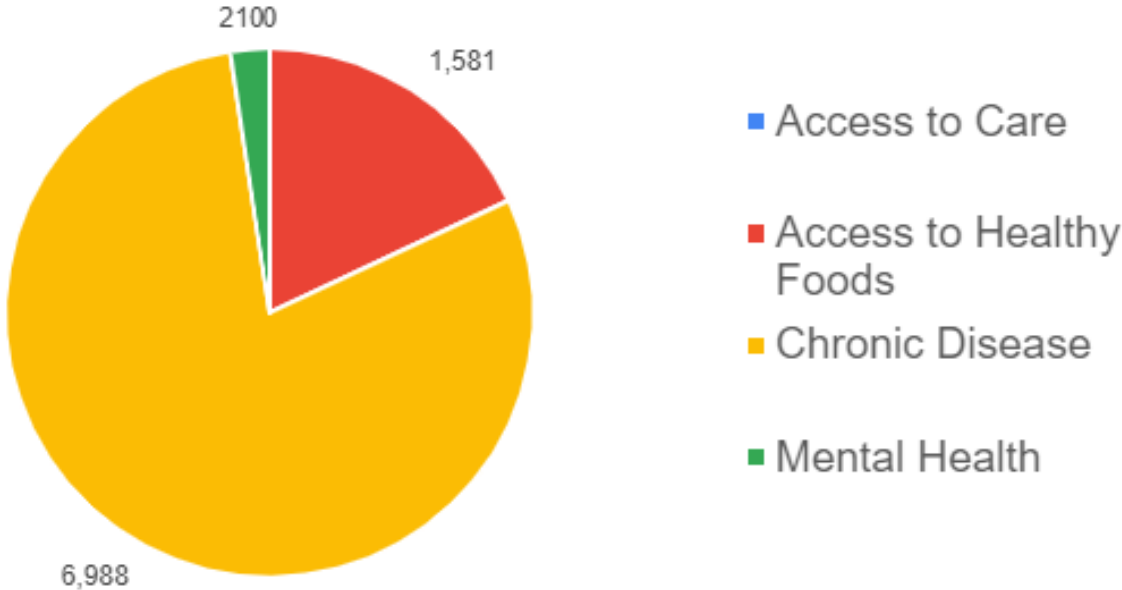
Collective Outcomes in Sussex County by CHIP Topic (# of individuals served)

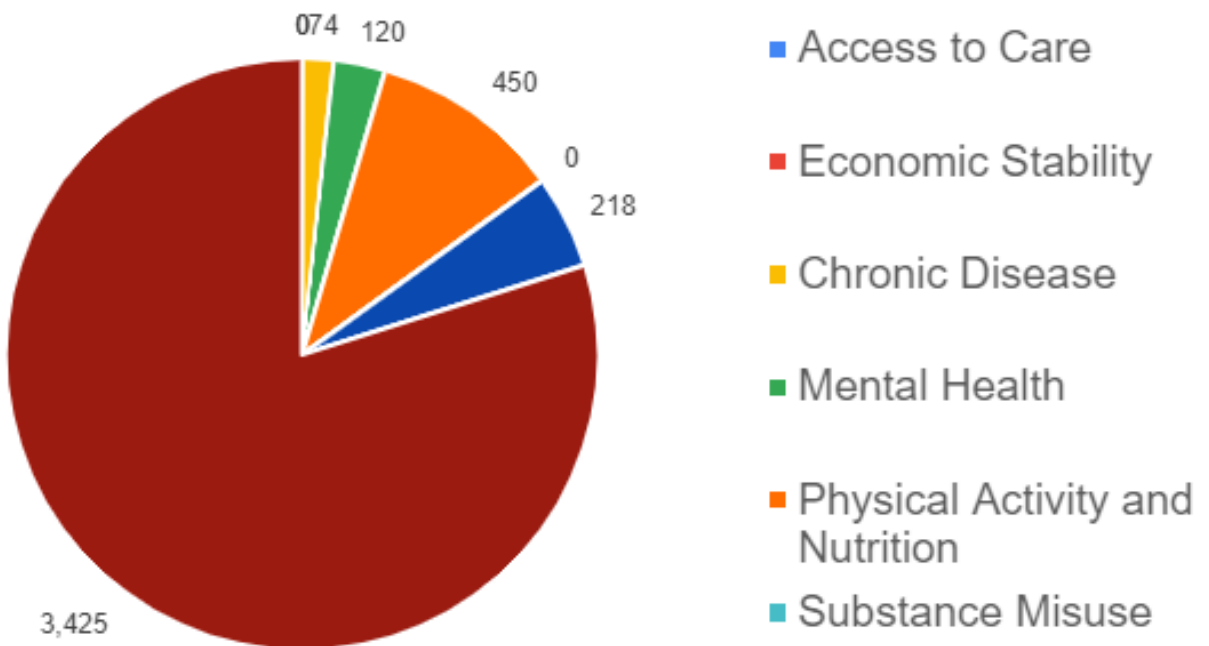
Collective Outcomes in Union County By CHIP Topic
(# of individuals served)



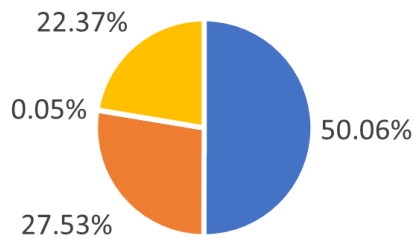
